#### TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS and COURSE DEVELOPMENT

#### MED 767 Staged Production (3). Contact Hrs. (3), S

This course provides MFA graduate students the space and time to complete their staged productions, whether it be web series, radio podcast series, or staged production.

# MED 766 Preproduction for Stage and Screen (3), Contact Hrs. (3), F

This course is a facilitation of rewrites, fundraising and time management for MFA graduate students to produce their web series, podcast series or staged production.

### MED 683/583 Advanced TV Production Co-Op (3) Contact Hrs. (6), S

This course is the culmination of the development and preproduction in our studio Covid friendly game show Co-Op. We have developed a 4-episode pilot season and a 5-episode second season of games. Each game reveals and artifact to reveal the winner.

# MED 597/697 Pre / Postproduction Co-Op (3) Contact Hrs. (5), F

Development of each season of Co-Op entails creative themes, games and puzzles to solve for visual appeal of this Covid friendly game show. 5 episodes are thought through, written, and tested. We also use Fall to finish up post-production on the previous season and release.

#### MED 583/483 Advanced Television Production Show-Me Chefs (3) Contact Hrs. (6) S

This course provides the upper division students with the opportunity to create a broadcast TV series. Students must learn to develop and produce a whole season of a competition cooking show. Plus produce smaller packages to incorporate into the longer 45 minutes program on broadcast deadlines.

#### MED 597/697 Pre / Postproduction Show-Me Chefs (3) Contact Hrs. (6-9), Su, F

Special Topics courses used to develop, plan and preproduce the next season of Show-Me Chefs TV series. It is also used to finish the pisodes and release to the broadcast station on deadline.

#### MED 470 Women Characters in Film (3) Contact Hrs. (5) Su

Using a feminist perspective, *Woman as Character* provides the students with an historical understanding of the women's roles in film. Student read film history that affected women's roles, and seminal pieces from feminist film theorists. Students have a better understanding of industry's impact on film roles for women, and gender roles in contemporary America.

#### MED 470 Women Directors (3) Contact Hrs. (5) Su

Using a feminist perspective Woman as Director provides the student with an historical cultural knowledge of women's contributions to the film industry as directors. Students will gain a better understanding of women's roles as directors and watch seminal and current films which reflect their ongoing presence within the industry.

#### MED 454 Media Analysis and Criticism (3) Contact Hrs. (3) F

Analysis and criticism provides students with an overview of critical theory which is applied to various media. It provides the students with the tools to examine media with a critical eye and to a forum in which we can discuss the implications of the analysis and criticism of chosen artifacts.

#### MED 383 Television Studio Production (3) Contact Hrs. (6) F, S

*Television Production* provides a practical application of studio theory and aesthetics. This course allows MJF majors to enhance production skills on the studio realm provide a solid foundation for upper division coursework, internships and any studio facility from news to commercial production houses.

#### MED 300 Special Topics in Media: LGBT Social History through Film (3) Contact Hrs. (5) D

Gay and Lesbian Social History through Film addresses the historical to current day activism for gay rights including visibility, struggle for equality, and other social issues of concern to LGBT people. Through readings, documentary films and guest lectures, this course can create a comfortable and open space for much needed conversations about LGBT visibility in Springfield MO and beyond.

# MED 220 Case Studies in Mass Media (3) Contact Hrs. (3) S

A case study approach investigating how the mass media cover a single significant public affairs issue through various media, such as Hurricane Katrina or health care reform. Emphasis will be placed on media literacy, media construction, and critical thinking as students consider the role that the mass media play in public discourse and social reality.

#### MED 120 Mass Media and Society (3) Contact Hrs. (3) S, F

Media in Society is a survey course that is covers all mediums of today media. It is taught from a cultural perspective in that media and culture have a symbiotic relationship in American culture today. The course is taught with a mass lecture and six break out sections. For this course I supervise two teaching assistants who teach the lab courses
